

Our Proposals

We are at an early stage of developing our proposals for Frodsham Solar.

The solar array development area is approximately 290 hectares.

The full site area, which also includes proposed access routes and grid connections, is currently 314 hectares.

Our proposals include areas of green spaces alongside and underneath the panels.

We will not develop on land designated for wildlife protection, including the protected area for wildlife by the Mersey Estuary.

Vehicles will access the site from the west by making use of existing routes.

We will install solar panels under and around some of the turbines from the existing Frodsham Wind Farm, enabling the site to produce renewable electricity from a mix of sources.

We are exploring opportunities to directly connect renewable electricity into local industry through new individual connections.

Frodsham Solar will export electricity to Frodsham substation. From here, up to 100 MW of electricity will be distributed across Cheshire and Merseyside.

All existing public rights of way will be maintained and protected, and we are exploring where new routes can be created.

We are currently assessing the most appropriate location for the substation and the energy storage system to be located.
